YOUTH CONFIRMATION CLASS


The Confirmation Class will have its first meeting, **Sunday**, **November 3rd**, **9:00 - 9:50** a.m. in the Parish Hall Library.

Thanks to a generous parishioner's donation, the church will provide a ham for each bag, so you will not need to buy hams this year!

HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP:

- There are also paper sign-up forms in the Narthex and Parish Hall. Our goal is to hand out 150 bags.
- Beginning on **Sunday**, **November 3rd**, you can pick up your custom St. Thomas' shopping bag(s) in the Parish Hall. Each bag includes a shopping list of items. *Please make sure to use ONLY the bags provided by St. Thomas'*.
- Go shopping! Each bag will provide food for a family of six. **Click on the button below to download a copy of the shopping list.** *Please remember: no glass containers, nuts, items that crumble or easily break, fresh food, or perishable items! Bags will be delivered before Thanksgiving and anything perishable will not last.*
- Return your bag(s) filled with Thanksgiving Dinner to St. Thomas' by Friday, November 22nd. Bags can be dropped off at the Parish Office, Monday thru Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., or dropped off in the Parish Hall each Sunday.
- We will need additional volunteer help on **Sunday**, **November 24th** to sort bags, and **Monday**, **November 25th** to deliver the bags to the Community Crisis Center. Please consider signing up for these volunteer opportunities if you are able!

A ST. THOMAS' STORY OF STEWARDSHIP

Youth Confirmation

Confirmation class is full of surprises. During a reading of the Christmas Story from Luke, the baby Jesus slides across a highly polished wooden floor at an astonishing speed, to giggles and laughter all around. A discussion of the concept of Hell ends with a young man saying, "I don't know, but I think Hell can just be a state of mind." Deep insights one would never expect from a child in middle-school alongside extreme silliness. Confirmation class has it all.

Paul Corbin and I have been teaching Confirmation together for fifteen years, and Paul has been at it for longer than that. We keep at it because we learn something new from every class we meet. We watch the kids enjoy the pleasure of giving, when we go to Target or the Dollar Store before the Christmas Extravaganza, where the kids purchase items to give to their peers needing help through the Community Crisis Center. A trip to First Fruits Farm to lend hands to the giving of food to those less fortunate, usually produces happy kids, especially if we are harvesting cabbages. That's when they get to use long knives to cut the cabbages from their stalks, all while Paul and I keep our heads on a swivel. Whether it is harvesting cabbages, picking beans, or bagging potatoes, the kids are all in.

The surprising thing about Confirmation class is the depth of the faith of our youth. Of course, it does not come out all the time in our discussions, but when it does, their faith is touching and real. Making the decision to become a part of the Church, to agree to follow Christ's teaching, is big for a child in middle school. Indeed, it is big at any age. There are those who pass through Confirmation because parents or grandparents expect it. But mostly we find that the Spirit has motivated our Confirmation candidates to do their best, and they happily and personally confirm the Baptismal vows made for them by their parents and Godparents. Sometimes a potential confirmand is not ready at the end of the program and says so. When that happens, we support them. There is always time to make the decision to follow Christ. God works in God's time.

Giving to St. Thomas' Church both through service and financial means has been a pleasure and a life-changing experience for me. I have been Registrar, Junior Warden, and Senior Warden, but none of those roles comes up to Confirmation teacher. Seeing the kids we help guide through their initial spiritual journey return to church as young adults, post-college, is one of the greatest pleasures of my life. Roll up your sleeves and jump into a ministry that interests you, and pledge with all your might. You'll never regret it.
