



ST. THOMAS' BECAUSE OF YOUR STEWARDSHIP

Our partnership with the COMMUNITY CRISIS CENTER has continued to flourish with a tremendous outpouring of gifts going to this very important organization. We provide household supplies, personal care supplies, clothing, household linens, fresh and nonperishable food, etc, as well as monetary donations to assist with purchasing items for the guests of the Center. The Community Crisis Center serves almost 40,000 individuals and households by home deliveries and driveway pick-ups. It's a tremendous outpouring of assistance to this community in need, and that need is continuing to increase. St. Thomas' contributions are numerous and vital to the Center. Have you seen the number of bags of food and supplies that are brought to the Center at holidays and monthly? It is amazing! At Thanksgiving, we provide 150 bags containing a Thanksgiving meal that includes 2 hams. At Christmas, we provide gifts and wrapped gift cards to families. This very important Outreach Ministry provides an opportunity for each parishioner to donate and help package up the donations for the Community Crisis Center. This type of stewardship is the core of our mission to be a servant church and community. Thank you to the volunteers who work tirelessly on this ministry: collecting, packaging, delivering, etc. Thank you to each parishioner who answers the call with tremendous stewardship to help those in need. And thank you to Margaret Green and Betsy Wilmerding for their outstanding leadership of all our Outreach Ministries.













REQUEST FOR AFGHAN SUPPORT

On March 12, a small group of volunteers from St. Thomas' and St. Marks' greeted the Hamyar family. They were some of the very few recent refugees from Afghanistan to be admitted into the United States.

This family of four arrived with 5 pieces of luggage. They are moved into an apartment at Renew Foundry Center, which is just down the street from our church. Several generous members have donated furniture and household items to help get them established.
