
The Six Triple Eight



ST. THOMAS' BECAUSE OF YOUR STEWARDSHIP

THE MUSIC MINISTRY at St. Thomas' is a wonderful and vital part of our 10:00 am Sunday worship. For some, our worship is enhanced by the silence of the 8:00 am service, allowing for a deeper connection with God in the quiet. For others, music can be that conduit that connects us to our Creator, a bridge that draws us in. We are so fortunate to have the leadership of Jon Waller, organ and piano accompanist Wanda Waller, and the 20-member choir, as well as occasional special guest musicians, adding even more richness to our worship. The choir includes folks who have been sharing their gifts of music with us for decades, and several very new members. This dedicated Music Ministry performed in June at the Cathedral of the Incarnation for the Ordination of our own Assistant Rector, the Rev. Amelia Bello. They have also offered a Vespers service at Blakehurst Senior Living Center. This ministry has a profound effect on the singers, musicians, and leaders, as well as all of us in the pews. Jon describes the act of performing and composing as tapping into a source that he has come to call God, thereby bringing the music to life and making the connection to God more available to those listening. The music at a worship service elevates the emotional and spiritual connection to the scripture readings, sermons, and prayers. As Jon says, "Music can get stuck in our heads and reminds us of beneficial spiritual principles in our daily lives." It also can be "one of the first things a non-spiritual person connects with when they attend a spiritual service" and "it can be a gateway to a deeper self-understanding and a spiritual discovery for the individual." Our Stewardship Theme this year is "Tell Out My Soul." It is the title and opening line of a hymn: "Tell out, my soul the greatness of the Lord. Unnumbered blessings gives my spirit voice..." We are so blessed to have such tremendous leadership and participants of the Music Ministry. Thank you to all who share your musical gifts with us, and thank you to the parish for your continued stewardship that enables this wonderful ministry to flourish at St. Thomas'
